## Luke chapter 1, verses 26-27 & 35

# <sup>26</sup> In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy God sent the angel Gabriel to a town in Galilee named Nazareth. <sup>27</sup> He had a message for a girl promised in marriage to a man named Joseph, who was a descendant of King David. The girl's name was Mary.

35 The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and God's power will rest upon you. For this reason the holy child will be called the Son of God".

## Matthew chapter 1, verses 21 & 23

<sup>21</sup> She will have a son, and you will name him Jesus - because he will save his people from their sins.
<sup>23</sup> "A young girl will become pregnant and have a son, and he will be called Immanuel" (which means "God is with us").
